The Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS), Veterinary Services (VS) certifies that:

1) **EITHER**

There have been no outbreaks of highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) (as this disease is defined by the World Organization for Animal Health [OIE]) in the United States in the 12 months prior to export; however, in case the Korean Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs (MAFRA) recognizes that an effective stamping out policy for HPAI is in place in the United States, the period can be shortened in accordance with the OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code.

**OR**

When highly pathogenic avian influenza occurs in the United States,

- a. The hens from which the eggs are derived were raised only in States free from high pathogenicity avian influenza (HPAI).
- b. The hens from which the eggs are derived were tested for HPAI in accordance with the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) with negative results.

- 2) There have been no outbreaks of Newcastle disease (as this disease is defined by the World Organization for Animal Health) within a 10-kilometer radius of the production farm, and processing/grading/packaging/storage establishments for at least 2 months prior to export.
- 3) There has been no confirmed diagnosis of Newcastle disease (as this disease is defined by the World Organization for Animal Health) in birds at the eggs' production farm based on surveillance that includes both clinical observations (passive surveillance) and laboratory testing conducted by the government of the United States or the government of the State in which the production farm is located within 60 days prior to export.
- 4) The hens from which the eggs are derived originated from farms participating in the National Poultry Improvement Plan, which is coordinated and administered by the government of the United States, and are free of *Salmonella pullorum*, *S. enteritidis*, and *S. gallinarum*.
